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Activities That Encourage Talking Wordless

Encourage your child to tell a story about a favorite event, or act it out. Wordless Books Wordless picture books give children the opportunity to tell the stories themselves. In telling their stories, children develop language skills and also get a sense of sequence of events in stories. Here are a few to get you started:

Activities that Encourage Talking Wordless Books

Skills you can teach with wordless picture books include: sequencing (beginning, middle, end) prediction. deductive reasoning (inference) connecting to background knowledge. reading confidence. dialogic reading (conversation about the story) writing dialogue. poetry writing.

Reading and Writing Activities for Wordless Picture Books

Your toddler's language will start to 'explode' soon, although your child has been learning about words, sounds and back-and-forth conversations since birth. You can keep encouraging toddler talking by singing, saying nursery rhymes, talking, reading and telling stories.

Encourage introspection in your children; it will help them understand themselves better as well as those around them. Practice taking turns with a talking stick or a ball, teaching your children that they can speak when they have the object but they are expected to listen when others are talking (Stanfield, 2017).

49 Communication Activities, Exercises, and Games

Shuffle the deck of cards thoroughly and walk around the room to give each student a card. Instruct the students to keep their card a secret. No one can see the type or color of another's card. Make it clear to students that they will not be able to speak during this exercise.

Consider parents' verbal English skills as you choose wordless picture books to use in your sessions. For parents with less proficient verbal skills, choose wordless picture books targeted for 2-3 year olds. For parents with more proficient verbal skills, choose wordless picture books targeted for 4-5 year olds.

Turn-taking. Any activities, exercises, and games that include these fundamentals can improve skills in communication. Interactive games encourage kids to express their needs. Plus, when kids see these activities as fun and engaging, the more likely they are to participate.

Wordless picture books push the reader to summarize, make inferences, interpret and evaluate visual information, ask questions, and make connections without any support from the written word. Young readers (pre-emergent, emergent, and early readers) can use wordless picture books to learn how the illustrations support and often drive a story.

The Power of Wordless Picture Books - Playful Learning

Sharing wordless books with a child provides an opportunity for literacy-rich conversations. Each "reader" listens and speaks, and creates their own story in their own words. Sharing wordless books also reinforces the idea that, in many books, the story and the pictures are connected.

Write the Story This is a great strategy to increase discussion with wordless books because there are an infinite number of ways to tell the story. I especially like this strategy with language learners because it allows for students to put their own words to a story.

Increasing Discussion with Wordless Books - Picture Book Brain

Place a pile of cards with random nouns in the center of each group. Have students take turns describing a noun for their group members to guess. The group member who guesses correctly keeps the card, so there's competition to see who has the most cards at the end of the game. Variation 3 is for advanced speakers.
