Hades is a Greek term used in the New Testament as a rough equivalent to the Hebrew word sheol and also describes the grave or location of the dead. Gehenna is a Greek word used in the New Testament that referred to the Valley of Hinnom, an actual valley outside of Jerusalem known as a burning rubbish pile.

It was Sheol: the Hebrew word for the netherworld, or abode of the dead (Greek: Hades). The "good" part of Sheol (Lk 16:19-31) is also called "paradise."

The word "hades" (hell, Auth. vers.) is found, as we have already seen, in the story of Lazarus and the rich man. The representative of the word in the Old Testament is sheol. "Paradise" is found in the Lord's reply to the dying thief, and in 2 Cor. xii., where Paul tells us he knew a man in Christ caught up into Paradise.

Hades and Eternal Punishment - Sheol - Hades - Gehenna ...

It is no answer to this, to say that Sheol contains two divisions, Hades and Paradise, and that the wicked go to the former. This is not in the Biblical text, or in its connection. The wicked who are threatened with Sheol, as the punishment of their wickedness, are not threatened with a part of Sheol, but with the whole of it.

Jesus' illustration of Lazarus and the rich man has caused some to believe that Paradise was in Sheol or hell. In Luke 16:9-31, Jesus tells His disciples that a certain rich man had ignored the needs of a beggar by the name of Lazarus. Eventually both the rich man and Lazarus died.

Sheol/hades is also called "paradise" where the thief on the cross and Christ went (Luke 23:43). Between these two compartments communication was possible (verses 24-31). However passing from one compartment to the other was impossible (verse 26).

Hades/Sheol--Where Do the Dead Go?

Hades without Paradise, i.e., without the O.T. saints will thus be emptied into the Lake of Fire at the resurrection of all unbelievers, and then the wicked will be cast into "hell" (Gehenna). PARADISE

" The Bible nowhere teaches that Hades, Sheol, or Hell has a Paradise with in it. Nor does the Bible teach that Christ went to Paradise only and not to the disobedient spirits in Hades (1Pe 3:19-20). First I would like to mention that the idea of Hades having two places, one of torment and one of paradise, comes from Greek mythology.

Refutation of "Abraham's Bosom" or "Paradise" in Hades ...

Question: "What is Abraham's bosom?" Answer: The term "Abraham's bosom" is found only once in the New Testament, in the story of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31), in which Jesus was teaching about the reality of heaven and hell. "Abraham's bosom" in this story is also translated "Abraham's side" (NIV, ESV), "next to Abraham" (CEV), "with Abraham" (NLT), and ...

Some take this passage to refer to Jesus entering hell (Sheol) before His resurrection. This interpretation is due, in large part, to the King James Version, which translates Sheol as "hell" in this passage. However, the Hebrew word sheol is a general reference to the grave, not a particular place in the afterlife.
