Although you can't create, run, or edit VBA (Visual Basic for Applications) macros in Excel for the web, you can open and edit a workbook that contains macros. Any existing macros will remain in the workbook, and you can open the workbook in the Excel desktop app to view and edit the macros. To edit a macro:

Work with VBA macros in Excel for the web - Excel
Go to your developer tab and click on "Visual Basic" to open the Visual Basic Editor. On the left side in "Project Window", right click on the name of your workbook and insert a new module. Just paste your code into the module and close it. Now, go to your developer tab and click on the macro button.

To create or edit a macro by using Visual Basic for Applications, do the following: On the View tab, choose Macros. In the Macro dialog box, type a name for the macro. In the Macro in list, click the template or the presentation that you want to store the macro in.

Microsoft Office documents — Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and other types of documents — can contain embedded code written in a programming language known as Visual Basic for Applications (VBA). You can record your own macros using the built-in Macro Recorder.

Notes: It is recommended that you sign macros only after your solution has been tested and ready for distribution: when code in a signed macro project is changed in any way, its digital signature is removed.However, if you have the valid digital certificate that was previously used to sign the project on your computer, the macro project is automatically re-signed when you save it.

Digitally sign your macro project - Office Support
Another method to enable macros in a file is via the Microsoft Office Backstage view, the view that appears after you click the File tab, when the yellow Message Bar appears. Click the File tab. In the Security Warning area, click Enable Content. Under Enable All Content, click Always enable this document's active content.

Enable or disable macros in Office files - Office Support
Actually, what I am trying to do is to activate the developer tab in Excel 365 so that I can record and execute VBA macros. The documentation suggests that I use the File-Options-Customize Ribbon and click on the Developer box to activate it.When I do so, it gives me the message:

When you use the References dialog box to directly reference another workbook, add-in, or object library file, you can run a macro contained in the referenced file using the Call statement and the macro name, or only the macro name.

Save a macro - Excel
The Readiness Report Creator can scan for VBA macros in Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, Access, Project, Visio, and Publisher files, for Office versions as far back as Office 2003. It can also scan for certain types of add-ins used with Office. Add-ins for all Office applications are identified, but it doesn't include web add-ins.

For enterprise administrators, turn on mitigations in Office that can help shield you from macro based threats, including this new macro-blocking feature. If your enterprise does not have any workflows that involve the use of macros, disable them completely. This is the most comprehensive mitigation that you can implement today.

New feature in Office 2016 can block macros and help ...
To get macros enabled in all Excel workbooks by default, this is what you need to do: Go to the File tab > Options. On the left-side pane, select Trust Center, and then click Trust Center Settings.... In the Trust Center dialog box, click Macro Settings on the left, select Enable all macros and click OK.
